	Post Graduate courses may require higher scores. Other English language qualifications may be considered.
	(<u>Please note</u> that international students who require a Tier 4 Study Visa will have to meet the UK Border Agency's requirements for English language
	proficiency. These may be higher than BU's requirements in some cases)

CREDIT TRANSFER

How it works	The <u>European Credit Transfer System</u> allocates 60ECTS for a year of full time study at undergraduate level. This is equivalent to 120 Bournemouth University (BU) credits/CATS.
	Hence, you will normally need to study 30ECTS (60 BU Credits) of appropriate academic level during one semester at BU, which is the normal credit weight of a semester of full time study. In general students study 3 units worth 10 ECTS credits each.
	1 ECTS = 2 BU Credits/CATS

HEALTH INSURANCE

Health Insurance	For your own safety, you must ensure that you have adequate health insurance arranged in your home country prior to entry to the UK.
	Students with a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC) are entitled to free NHS treatment in the UK. Students must contact the health authority in their home country to arrange to complete the relevant forms.
